Maria Mysachenko - latest short bio 1500 characters

Maria Mysachenko is from Kiyw and grew up in Germany. She made her debut at 15 as Sophie in Britten's children's opera "The Little Chimney Sweeper" at the Theater Bonn. At 16, she completed acting training with Kaća Čelan and later studied singing at the HfMT Cologne and the Buchmann-Mehta School of Music Tel Aviv.

The young singer feels at home in opera, musical, drama and oratorio and enthusiastically covers all epochs from baroque to modern.

During her studies she already interpreted Cleopatra in Handel's "Giulio Cesare in Egitto", the Queen of the Night in Mozart's "The Magic Flute" and was internationally active as a soloist in numerous oratorios.

As Flora in Benjamin Britten's "The Turn of the Screw," the coloratura soprano was heard for the first time last season at the Theater und Orchester Heidelberg.

In May 2022, she made her debut in the world premiere of the contemporary opera "Durst" at the Dvořák Festival in Olomouc, Czech Republic, together with the Prague ensemble Musica Florea; this was followed in October by another world premiere, "Psychosa" by Ulla & Yehuda Almagor at the Teatron Theater Arnsberg, where Mysachenko mimed an allegorical female character as singer and actress. September 2023 envisions a revival of "Psychosa." In addition, the soprano recently appeared in concert in Cologne as a soloist in Mozart's "Great Mass in C Minor" and Mendelsohn's "Psalm 42."
